#### 6.1 Tall Timber Student Housing Budget Update

Management provided a summary of the budget update. It was reported that the project is currently in the 75% to 80% range of completion with approximately \$2M to \$3M remaining (which includes the additional funding for the project).

**IT IS HEREBY RESOLVED, SECONDED AND CARRIED THAT** the Board of Governors approve an increase to the Tall Timber Student Housing project budget in the amount of up to \$2.6M funded as follows:

- 1. The amount of \$1.1M to be funded through surplus FY2023/24 Routine Capital as approved by the Ministry of Post-Secondary Education and Future Skills; and
- 2. The amount of up to \$1.5M subject to securing additional donations by BCIT Foundation.

### 6.2 Five-Year Capital Plan
